Ladies and Gentlemen,

As we pursue our meaningful work of caring for our community, we continue to hear news of COVID-19 spikes around the nation. This week, the media reported that the U.S. recorded more than 100,000 new cases in a single day. This increase is a concerning trend that we are monitoring very closely. Fortunately in our South Florida region, after a small increase in COVID-19 activity, we have seen our numbers remain relatively steady this week. We are currently caring for 153 patients who are COVID-19 positive or suspected to be positive. Our numbers of COVID-19 admissions and discharges have fluctuated recently and are in balance. To date we have discharged more than 7,000 patients who were treated for the virus.

Please continue to take precautions for your own health and wellbeing, and emphasize the importance of this with others. Together, we all need to continue the best practices for preventing the spread of COVID-19. As healthcare workers we are also in the position of being able to educate our friends and family about safety measures, the importance of not delaying care, and where to go to get testing and other types of care.

Testing Update

We are continuing to see large numbers of patients who are seeking testing at our urgent care centers. With the rapid antigen test, standard PCR test and antibody test available, volumes remain heavy.

We continue to look for ways to increase our internal PCR test capacity with various modalities in use across the system. For tests that need to be sent to external reference labs, we are receiving 85% of results within 72 hours.

Many thanks to all who are working hard to provide these very important services to our community.

Update on Cyber Threats

The Information Technology team continues to shore up Baptist Health's cyber defenses to protect our systems and data against the ransomware threat believed to be targeted against healthcare. Please remain hyper vigilant and follow basic security hygiene. Do not click on links or attachments contained in emails from unknown sources, especially when they are marked [External]. Never enter your username and password when prompted by a link within an external email. If the external email contains suspicious links, attachments, or prompts for passwords, forward it to <u>SuspiciousMail@baptisthealth.net</u> right away. To report any concerns, call the IT Rapid Response Center at 786-527-8977.

New Intranet Coming Soon


