Ladies and Gentlemen,

We are still seeing COVID-19 cases rise across the country, and we are beginning to see that occur in our community as well. We are watching these upticks closely, as we expect this increase to continue over the next few weeks. How high those numbers will go is to be determined, but this is the time for us to hold the line and make sure we are ready to care for our community should we experience a significant increase. We are even more prepared and experienced today after going through the last two surges and learning lessons that will continue to help us navigate this pandemic.

Currently, we are caring for 148 patients who are either positive for COVID-19 or are under investigation. That is a 14% increase from seven days ago, and a 16% increase from two weeks ago. We are seeing high numbers of patients seeking testing at our Urgent Care Centers.

PPE

Our Supply Chain team and PPE Taskforce continues to ensure we have a sufficient supply of proper PPE. As the number of COVID-19 cases go up, it is imperative that we continue to use these supplies judiciously in order to maximize our supply.

Cyber threats

In response to a notification about a cyber threat intended to disrupt information systems at healthcare organizations across the U.S., our IT Security department has taken multiple proactive measures to safeguard Baptist Health's systems and data. One of those precautions is blocking specific file sharing sites that are being used to host and deploy malicious files used for ransomware. These sites include: Docs.Google.com and Drive.Google.com, Basecamp.com, Jetbrains.com, Trello.com, Slack.com, and Yougile.com. You will also not be able to access your personal email from the Baptist Health network at this time.

As a precautionary measure, please consult with your leadership on any downtime preparations that might be necessary.

Please be vigilant online. Do not click on links or attachments contained in emails marked [External]. Do not open any email attachments you were not expecting to receive. Never enter your username and password when prompted by a link within an external email. If the external email contains suspicious links, attachments, or prompts for passwords, forward it to <u>SuspiciousMail@baptisthealth.net</u> right away. To report any concerns, call the IT Rapid Response Center at 786-527-8977.
